 - ECMP: Ethical Reasoning
 - ICMP: Intercultural Competency
- 4 **divisional ways of knowing** (CASH)
- 1 interdisciplinary 300-level **capstone**

What to Expect From Your Schedule

- 3 classes:
 - RCC class (released in June)
 - 1 competency class -or-
 - 1 class in potential major/minor -or-
 - 1 elective class

FAQ: Why did I get these classes?

- YOU selected it on your course preference form
- YOU indicated this course as a possible major interest
- YOU indicated that this field was one of your favorites in high school
- It satisfies a General Education competency requirement
- It satisfies an elective requirement
- Remember that you need 16 **elective** credits to graduate ("Everything counts!")

Keep Calm and Keep in Mind:

- Only 20% of Rollins students major in the area of study they thought they would when they arrived – that's why you start as "Exploring"
- You will get to pick your fourth class when you meet with your advisor in August!
